2. Organizational Inspection Program inspections are essential to the organizational assessment of USASMA. They are an important tool to assess the readiness of our organization, identify areas that require additional training, and highlight problems that require resolution. USASMA will have a comprehensive inspection program to conduct our mission while complementing other training.

3. The USASMA will conduct all inspections in accordance with the inspection principles and elements outlined in AR 1-201. Inspections are training events and will be scheduled as such. Inspectors must ensure that the primary and special staffs and subordinate organizations have the knowledge and ability to fix any identified deficiencies.

4. USASMA Plans and Operations will schedule all inspections. Internal inspections will not be scheduled that do not support the organizations priorities, goals, and objectives.

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5. The Director Plans and Operations will designate the OIP coordinator. The OIP Coordinator will monitor follow-up inspection results to ensure timely implementation of the recommended corrections.
